SUBJECT: Issues Update

The following are issues related to the City for the weekly Issues Update. If there are additional items you believe should be included, please let me know.

CENSUS 2010 DATA – AGE GROUPS BY RACE. As more detailed data from the 2010 Census is released, we are able to see a picture of Peoria at a higher level of detail. One of the areas in which some of the new data sheds light is the racial makeup of Peoria by age group.

The attached pie charts **(Electronic Copy Only)** indicates the racial breakdown of Peoria by total population; population 18 & older; and population under 18. It is apparent; the population under 18 chart shows an entirely different population composition than either the total or 18 & older charts.

2011 ALLEY LIGHT PROGRAM. As part of the 2011 Community Development program, the City Council allocated \$25,000 for the Alley Light Program. This program provides dusk-to-dawn security lights for properties that adjoin an alley.

Following the required procurement process, the Council approved Lumintek Electric as the selected light supplier. However, upon receipt of the lighting units, it was discovered that they did not meet the bid packet specifications. In subsequent conversation with the bidder, it was established that they would be unable to meet the specifications. The second lowest bidder, BJB Enterprises was contacted, but was unable to provide the specified light. The next lowest bidder, Kirby Risk, is able to provide the lighting unit as outlined in the specifications. The difference in total cost to provide the 100 lighting units is \$279. Due to the issues with the first two bidders, the City will enter into an agreement with Kirby Risk to provide the lighting units for the 2011 Alley Light Program.

N. UNIVERSITY STREET AND W. GLEN AVENUE INTERSECTION PROJECT. Scott Reese, Project Manager and Laura Savorgino, Resident Engineer will be on point for this project.
