APPLICATION FOR LANDMARK DESIGNATION

LEGAL DESCRIPTION:

Original Town of Peoria (Civic Center Addition) NW  
Quarter & NE Quarter, Section 9-8-8E, Lot 2, 0.639 Acres  
Block 12.

To Commissioners of the Preservation Commission, Mayor  
James Maloof, Members of the City Council and Wayne  
Anthony.

Construction of the Peoria City Hall was begun in 1897 and  
finished in 1899. It embodies distinguishing characteristics  
of architectural and historical significance.

The building portrays a sense of time when superior crafts-  
manship and materials were used to construct public buildings.  
This structure represents an era of prosperity the city was ex-  
periencing during the time of its' construction. (Criteria A  
and B, Peoria Preservation Ordinance, pg. 8).

The facade is constructed of red Lake Superior sandstone, and  
is well balanced. Three horizontal sections display three  
styles of windows. The design is of Middle European (Flemish)  
Renaissance influence. The skylight, central staircase, gallery  
railings with intricately designed cast iron embellishments are  
among the many features of this building. (Criteria C, Peoria  
Preservation Ordinance, pg. 8).

The City Hall is now in a high state of preservation, and is  
presently on the National Register of Historic Places. It has  
been marked with the oval symbolic marker by the Central Illi-  
nois Landmarks Foundation. It is a true Peoria landmark.

The Markers Committee of the Central Illinois Landmarks Foundat-  
ion submits this application to the Commission to so honor this  
building by designating it as a Peoria City Landmark.




